Summer Leadership Meeting in Bloomington (Cory)

- The Association is still in transition.
- ACUI website is a one-stop shopping opportunity to our members. All info pertaining to ACUI is on the site.
- The meeting was very good. Regional Directors, Board of Trustees and special appointments were all invited to this meeting. This is unprecedented.
- ACUI Needs Assessment is complete. You can view the results on-line.
- The Association has some financial issues. Thus, the creation of the Foundation. There is a target goal of \$100,000 to cover start up costs for the Foundation. \$84,000 was raised at the annual conference in DC. The regions have been asked to contribute \$1000 annually for 2 years. This amount was not supported; however, \$500 was agreed upon by the RDs to bring back to their individual regions for support. [We will bring this request to our fall conference for discussion and vote.](#)
- College Bowl wants to consolidate the regions into super-regions. A survey will be out in August soliciting feedback on a proposed restructuring. This year's regional tournament structure will remain the same. A final decision will be made in March. The University of MN won nationals.
- Rec Tournament
  - Sponsorship for bowling for the Rec Tournament has ceased.
  - Regions are on their own for their regional tournaments.
  - National tournaments will still be offered for table tennis and billiards; possibly bowling.
- Several regions combine College Bowl and Rec Tourneys.
- Annual Conference in Reno on March 20-25, 2005.
  - The Fun(d) Run has changed to the River Path Challenge.
  - We need to put together a regional basket for the Silent Auction.
  - Potential keynoters: Susan Komives, Bryan O'Malley, Marcia Herman-Betzen

Fall Conference (Tara)

- We are not bringing anyone from the Central Office to our conference this year.
- Tom has agreed to chair the Siggelkow-Starr selection process.
- Registration will be located at the hotel lobby and in Coffman

- The Radisson is our main hotel (\$84/night + taxes + daily parking). There is also a block at the Days Inn (\$65/night).

#### State of Region 10 (Cory)

- Region 10 is very healthy.
- We have \$30,850.78 in our account.
- We sent 2 students to ILEAD – one from Minnesota State University Moorhead and one from University of North Dakota. There were approximately 55 students at ILEAD.
- We have 36 member institutions.
  - IA – 6, Wartburg College is a new member; Grinnell & Palmer College of Chiropractic have dropped
  - MN – 24, no drops or adds & 6 associate members (Charthouse Learning –most recent)
  - ND – 2, Valley City State has dropped
  - SD – 3, Black Hills State & Northern State have dropped
  - Manitoba – 1, Red River CC has dropped
  - Individually, we have 197 members
- Stop the Hate has been rescheduled for October 18-20, 2004 at Macalester College.
- Region 10 has been represented in the last 2 Bulletins. In May, Maucker Union was in the Union Spotlight; July, Bemidji State University.
